

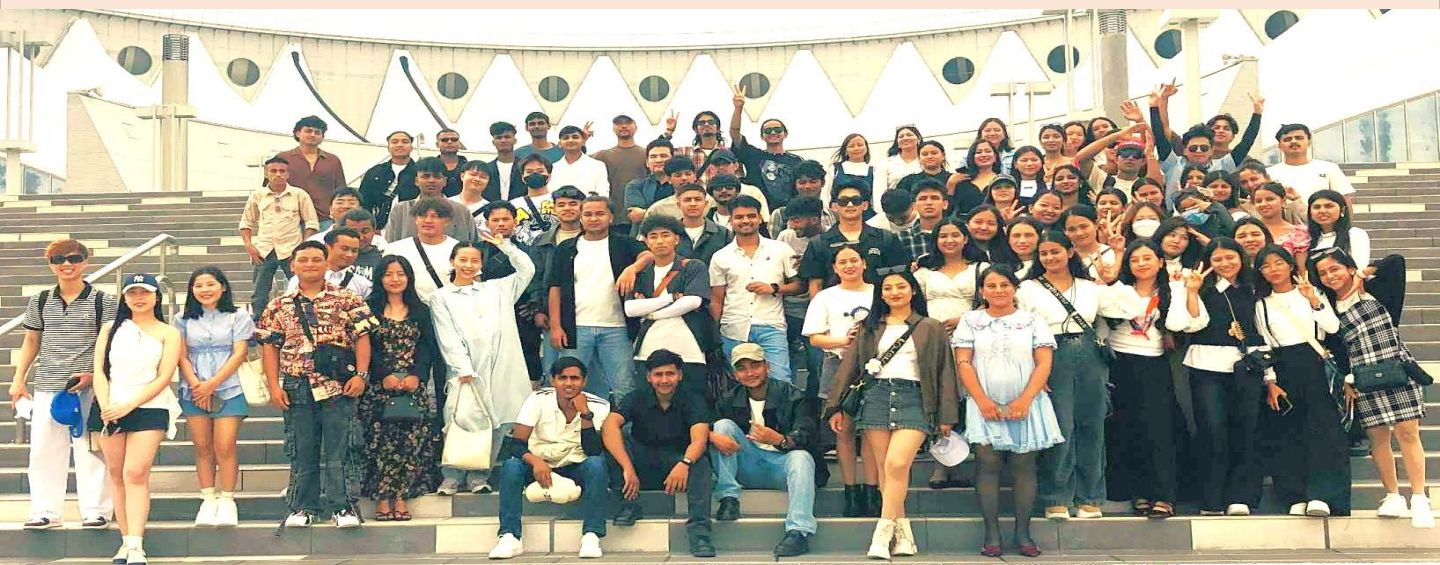

# SCHOOL OVERVIEW



## ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Our school is a technical vocational school established in 1983. It is one of the largest vocational schools in Kumamoto Prefecture. In addition, our school belongs to Kaishin Gakuen Educational Corporation, and Kaishin High School, the parent institution of Kaishin Gakuen, has a history of more than one hundred years.

In 1991, the International Information Center was constructed, and in 2000, the Japanese Language Course was newly established with the aim of preparing students for advancement to universities and vocational schools and of fostering engineers with Japanese language proficiency. In addition to the Japanese Language Course, our school offers the Automobile Engineering Course and the Semiconductor Engineering Course.

After studying Japanese for 2 years in the Japanese Language Course, many international students advance to the specialized course of our school and acquire professional skills for a further 2 years. After that, they receive job offers from Japanese companies, obtain work visas, and are active in Japan.

The Japanese Language Course of our school places emphasis on fostering capable individuals who have an understanding of Japanese culture and society, are able to communicate smoothly, and possess the ability to think from a broad perspective. Already, many students have advanced to universities and vocational schools throughout Japan and have taken their first steps toward their dreams.

To all of you who will shape the future—now is the time to take the first step. Let us walk together toward your dreams!

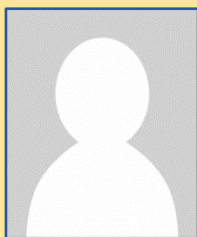
## LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

## COMOREHENSIVE SUPPORT SYSTEM

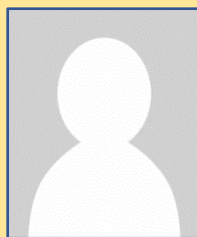

- The school provides assistance with matters necessary for daily life in Japan, such as notification of change of residence, enrollment in the National Health Insurance and National Pension systems, opening bank accounts, signing mobile phone contracts, and introducing part-time jobs.

Our school has Nepali staff members who are able to respond to various consultations from students in their native language.

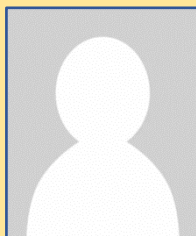

We place great importance on supporting each individual student with care, so that you can achieve the dreams you envision and enjoy a fulfilling and meaningful study abroad experience.

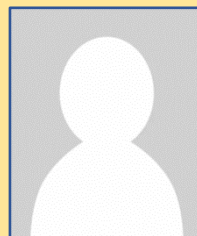

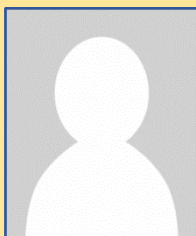

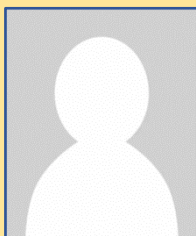

# JAPANESE LANGUAGE COURSE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- ① All prescribed subjects must be completed.
- ② The cumulative attendance rate from the time of enrollment must be 80% or higher.
- ③ Tuition fees and all other school fees must be paid in full.

## SPECIALIZED COURSES OF OUR SCHOOL

In addition to the Japanese Language Course, our school offers two courses specializing in industrial technology: the Automobile Engineering Course, which aims to train students to become Class 2 automobile mechanics, and the Semiconductor Engineering Course, where students learn technologies related to semiconductors and machinery. Each course has its own curriculum, and supports students in obtaining various qualifications while they are enrolled. Students who advance from our Japanese Language Course to the specialized courses are exempt from the admission fee (¥100,000). Upon graduation from the specialized courses, students are awarded the title of "Specialist", which leads to advantageous employment opportunities. After receiving a job offer, it is also possible to obtain a work visa.



### AUTOMOBILE ENGINEERING COURSE

Designated by the Minister of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism as a Class I Automobile Mechanic Training Institution.

### SEMICONDUCTOR ENGINEERING COURSE

Accredited by the Japan Personal Computer Software Association as a Testing Site for the CAD Utilization Technology Engineer Examination.



International students and Japanese students are studying at the same school.

Through classes on Japanese society and culture, students acquire an understanding of Japanese society and culture and can prepare for a smooth start to social life.

If students proceed from our Japanese Language Course to our specialized courses, the admission fee (¥100,000) will be waived.

# SUPPORT

## PART-TIME JOB SUPPORT

- Information on part-time job opportunities is provided to international students.
- Guidance is provided on how to write a resume, proper manners when making phone calls, and points to keep in mind during job interviews.
- In the case of a student visa, the maximum number of hours permitted for part-time work is 28 hours per week. If students have multiple part-time jobs, the total number of hours for all jobs combined must not exceed 28 hours per week. In addition, engaging in industries considered inappropriate for students constitutes a violation of the law (violation of permission to engage in activities other than those permitted under the status of residence), regardless of the nature of the work.

•Lunch Box Preparation	: Filling lunch box containers with prepared food
•Packaging Work	: Processing and packaging fish, meat, and vegetables in food factories or stores
•Parcel Delivery Service	: Parcel sorting work
•Medical Device Manufacturing Factory	: Manufacturing medical device components
•Cooking Assistant	: Assisting with food preparation in the kitchen
•Convenience Store	: Cash register operation, arranging merchandise, and other duties
•Food Processing	: Processing and manufacturing frozen foods
•Semiconductor Factory	: Manufacturing semiconductor components

## **SAPKOTA BADHRI PRASAD (Nepal)**

**Kumamoto Technical College Automobile Maintenance Course Graduated**

**Certificate of Automobile Maintenance Engineer at level 2 Working at IHD Japan Ltd.**

**(After working, obtained Level 2 Gasoline Auto Mechanic Certification and Level 1 Keeper Coating Technician Certification. After serving as a maintenance supervisor, passed the National Automobile Inspector Examination «First foreigner in the Kumamoto prefecture»)**

I was born in Nepal in 1987. Since childhood, I had a strong interest in Japanese anime and movies and dreamed of visiting Japan. After graduating from high school in Nepal, I decided to study in Japan and arrived in 2013. I studied Japanese at Kumamoto YMCA and later enrolled in Kumamoto Technical College's Automotive Engineering Department, graduating in 2017.

After graduation, I joined IHD Japan Co., Ltd. as a mechanic. While working, I passed the JLPT N2 and obtained various job-related certifications, including an Automobile Insurance Agent License and Level 1 Keeper Coating Technician Certification. Recognized as an outstanding employee, I was promoted to Maintenance Supervisor. I then passed the Level 2 Gasoline Auto Mechanic Certification and successfully cleared the highly challenging National Automobile Inspector Examination on my first attempt—becoming the first foreigner in the prefecture to do so.

Currently, I work as a factory manager. In July 2024, I obtained permanent residency in Japan and continue to enjoy a fulfilling life. I believe that my accumulated efforts have shaped who I am today.

**Q1. What are the features of this Kumamoto Technical College?**

**Ans:** In addition to the Japanese Language Course, our school has 2 specialized courses: the Automobile Engineering Course and the Semiconductor Engineering Course. After graduating from the Japanese Language Course, students may also advance internally to these specialized courses of our school. After completing the specialized courses, they can work as engineers.

**Q2. When can I enroll?**

**Ans:** April and October.

**Q3. When and how do I apply?**

**Ans:** For April enrollment, the required documents must be prepared by the middle of August of the previous year. For October enrollment, the documents must be prepared by the middle of February of the same year. Since an interview and other procedures are also required, please contact the person in charge as early as possible.

**Q4. What are the possible career paths after graduating from the Japanese Language Course?**

**Ans:** Many students advance internally to the specialized courses of our school, but they may also continue their studies at other vocational schools.

**Q5. How much are the monthly living expenses?**

**Ans:** Compared with major cities, the cost of living in Kumamoto is relatively low, and the average monthly living expenses of our current students are approximately ¥50,000.

**Q6. Can I work part-time?**

**Ans:** Yes. If permission to engage in activities other than those permitted under the status of residence is granted by the Immigration Services Agency of Japan, students may work part-time within the permitted hours and types of work. Incidentally, the maximum number of hours permitted for such activities is 28 hours per week. During long vacation periods, such as summer vacation, students may work up to 8 hours per day.

**Q7. Does the school introduce part-time jobs?**

**Ans:** Yes. In fact, many students are working part-time through introductions provided by the school. However, a certain level of Japanese language proficiency is often required.

**Q8. What support and insurance are available if I become ill or injured in Japan?**

**Ans:** We will introduce you to a hospital. If you are concerned about communicating in Japanese, our staff will provide support. In addition, all students are enrolled in the National Health Insurance system prescribed by the Japanese government, and therefore only 30% of the medical expenses are borne by the individual. Furthermore, payments are also provided through the compensation plan independently subscribed to by our school, making the actual out-of-pocket expense effectively zero. (Exceptions may apply depending on the type of treatment and the number of treatment days.)
